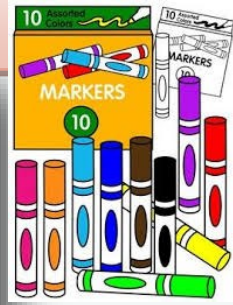

Thank you to all who supported our virtual Book Fair this year. It was a huge success! Mrs. Reimche was able to purchase a fine collection of new books for our library.

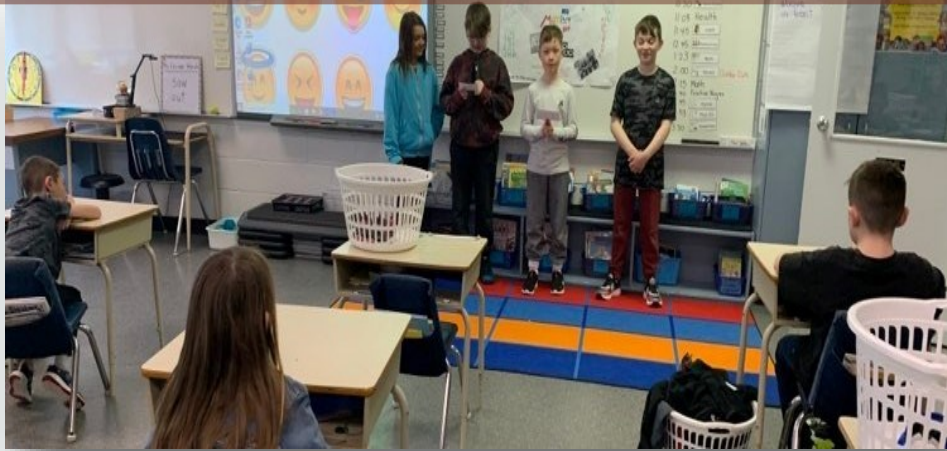

It was a perfect chance for Grade 4's to practice their presentation skills and Grade 2's practiced their listening skills while learning about the Indigenous groups of Manitoba

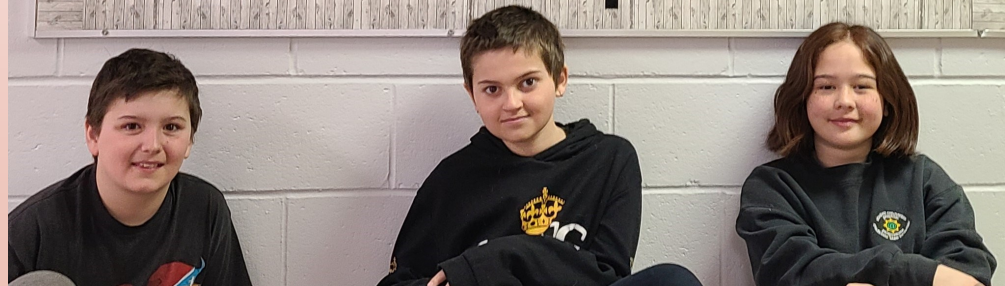
